



Bedwell Valley Trail Work Party - Summer 2024

The Friends of Strathcona Park (FOSP) have been working since the 1990s to restore and maintain the Bedwell Trail, a unique coast-to-coast route through Strathcona Park. Our latest trail work took place from August 15–21, with volunteers tackling overgrown sections, installing markers, and assessing creek crossings for future improvements.

We would like to acknowledge our intrepid work party volunteers Petra Strougal, Ian Holm, Dave Osmond, Susan Holvenstot, Sean Anderson and Tim Hanson. for their hard work and dedication. Our sincere gratitude to you all for laying down the groundwork for this important initiative.

Despite long days and challenging weather, significant progress was made. However, the work remains ongoing. High-priority projects include replacing the K2 Creek crossing with a sturdy bridge, further trail clearing, and possible rerouting of eroded sections. We are seeking an engineer to collaborate with BC Parks on designing the new bridge—if you or someone you know can help, please reach out!

In Remembrance

We are saddened to share the passing of two cherished members of FOSP, Pat Halliday and Myrna Boulding.

Pat Halliday, a longtime advocate for both people and nature, passed away in September 2024. Her diverse career as a nanny, nurse, mother, Comox Town Residents Association president, Forest Land Commissioner, and passionate environmentalist reflected her deep commitment to her community and the natural world. Pat and her husband, Bill, were dedicated FOSP members, actively involved in the organization's early days when Strathcona Park faced significant threats. Her legacy of environmental protection and advocacy will not be forgotten.

On December 12, 2024, Myrna Boulding passed away at the age of 89. Alongside her late husband, Jim Boulding, Myrna co-founded Strathcona Park Lodge, British Columbia's first outdoor education center. Jim's efforts to protect the park from government-backed logging and mining in the mid-1980s led to the formation of FOSP, and while Myrna couldn't be directly involved due to her business, she remained a steadfast supporter. Her generosity and commitment to conservation continue through her children, who actively uphold her legacy.

Both Pat and Myrna played important roles in protecting Strathcona Park, and their passion for environmental stewardship will be deeply missed.

The first step will be building a bridge over K2 Creek, with potential brush clearing along the route to Bedwell Lake. Looking ahead, we hope to tackle the section towards the landslide, You Creek, and Sundew Lake in the summer of 2026.

This marks an exciting shift—from working to protect the park from industrial use (as Ruth Masters famously said, from becoming a "Goodie Bag") to actively partnering with BC Parks to restore and maintain these incredible trails. By doing so, we continue to safeguard the park while making its beauty more accessible.
